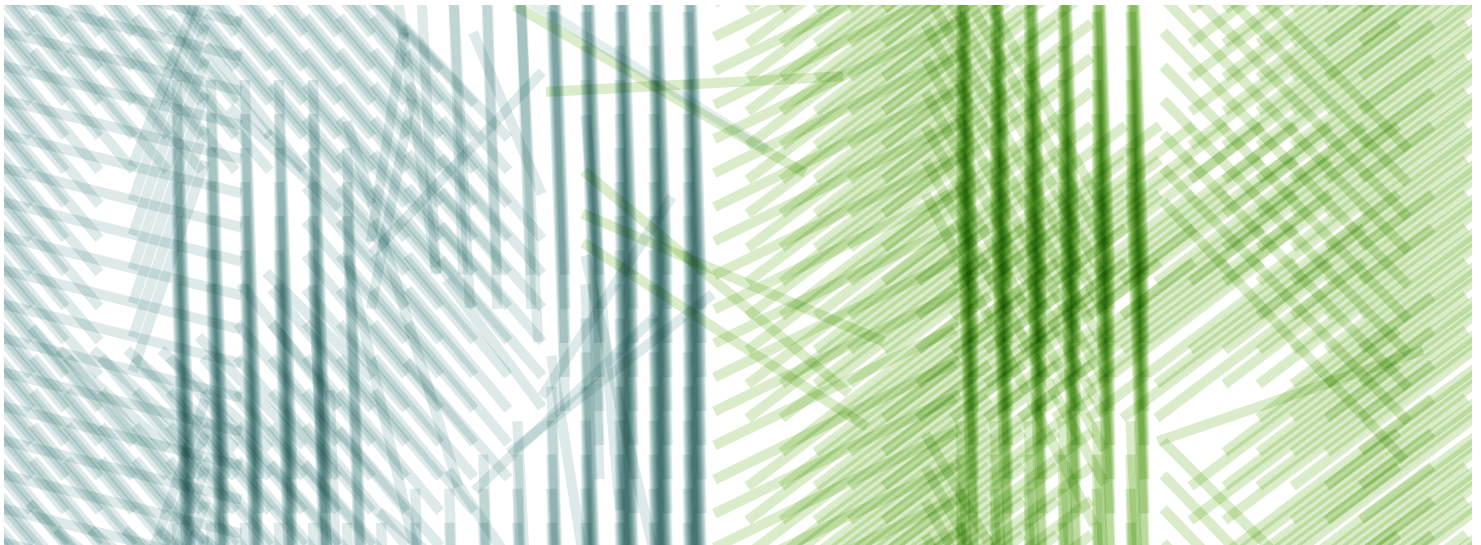

# Better Together: Understanding the Role of Relationships in Educational Change

We live in an interconnected world where our relationships and interactions can affect educational outcomes. Deep change in these outcomes does not necessarily result from formal plans and blueprints. Instead, improvement seems to emerge and maintain its momentum through the relationships between individuals within our social networks. It is the interdependence of these networks that may influence or even determine the direction, speed, and depth of efforts to enhance outcomes as well as the formation of research-practice partnerships. We will not understand how change really happens and where it can break down if we disregard the quality of our social ties.

ALAN J. DALY is Professor of Education at the University of California, San Diego. He has been working in public education for over 15 years and has held positions ranging from classroom teacher to district psychologist to site administrator. He has presented the findings of his research and practice at local to international level, covering the fields of organizational learning, leadership, educational policy reform and implementation, and social network theory and analysis.
